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SAMUEL RYKER: b. November 4, 1769, in Bergen Co., New Jersey (bp. December 3, 1769, at Closter, Bergen Co., New Jersey), d. 1835, in Jefferson Co., Indiana. m. (firstly) May 5, 1790, in Jefferson Co., Kentucky, to Barbara Fullenwider (b.b. 1765-1775, d. June 16, 1829, in Jefferson Co., Indiana). m. (secondly) May 4, 1830, in Jefferson Co., Indiana, to Margaret — -Holton (b.b. 1760-1770). Samuel is listed in the 1790 Federal Census for Kentucky as living in Jefferson Co. He is listed in the 1794 thru 1806 Kentucky State Tax Lists and 1800 and 1810 Federal Censuses for Kentucky as living in Shelby Co., owning 50 acres of land located on Bullskin Creek, and 15 cattle. Samuel first moved to Indiana in 1807, becoming a perminate settler in 1811. He purchased from the Jeffersonville, Indiana Land Office the west ½ of section 9, township 5, north range 11 east, in Shelby Twp., Jefferson Co., Indiana. This was recorded at the Recorder's office at Madison, Indiana on March 30, 1813. Samuel ran for a position in the first Indiana State Legislature during the summer of 1817, but lost. He is listed in the 1820 and 1830 Federal Censuses for Indiana as living in Jefferson Co. The Bethel Meeting House, started in 1812 and organized in 1818, was first called "Ryker's Meeting House" and "Ryker's Settlement." This church was located on part of the original Samuel Ryker land purchase. The present church is on the original site. The old family cemetery still exists. Samuel and Barbara are buried in the old Ryker Cemetery, located on his farm near the Bethel Meeting House (now the Jefferson Presbyterian Church), near Canaan, in Shelby Twp., Jefferson Co., Indiana.

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RACHEL RYKER: b. June 19, 1773, at Closter, Bergen Co., New Jersey (bp. July 18, 1773, at the Reformed Dutch Church of Tappan, New Jersey), d. October 23, 1861, in Wapello Co., Iowa. m. (firstly) January 5, 1791, in Jefferson Co., Kentucky, to Henry Houghland (d.c. 1792, in Kentucky). m. (secondly) December 31, 1793, in Shelby Co., Kentucky, to William Robins (d.c. 1797, in Kentucky). m. (thirdly) November 18, 1797, in Shelby Co., Kentucky, to Samuel Smock (b. October 7, 1776, in Berkeley Co., Virginia, d. July 5, 1833, in Jefferson Co., Indiana), the son of Jacob Smock and Catherine (Tryntie) Demarest. Rachel and Samuel were second cousins. Henry Houghland was killed by Indians. William Robbins was also killed by Indians. He was also scalped. In March 1794 Samuel Smock was wounded by Indians, during an ambush. His older brother Mathew was killed and his younger brothers John and Peter were captured, taken as prisoners, and held by the Indians until ransomed for a keg of rum by their father in July 1795. RACHEL RYKER: b. June 19, 1773, at Clo: (bp. July 18, 1773, at the Reformed Dutch (d. October 23, 1861, in Wapello Co., Iowa. in Jefferson Co., Kentucky, to Henry Hough m. (secondly) December 31, 1793, in Shelby Robins (d.c. 1796, in Kentucky). m. (thirdly) November 18, 1797, in Shelby Co., Kentucky, to Samuel Smock (b. October 7, 1776, in Berkeley Co., Virginia, d. July 5, 1833, in Jefferson Co., Indiana), the son of Jacob Smock and Catherine (Tryntie) Demarest. Rachel and Samuel were second cousins. Henry Houghland was killed by Indians. William Robbins was also killed by Indians. He was also scalped. In March 1794 Samuel Smock was wounded by Indians, during an ambush. His older brother Mathew was killed and his younger brothers John and Peter were captured, taken as prisoners, and held by the Indians until ransomed for a keg of rum by their father in July 1795. Samuel is listed in the Kentucky State Tax Lists from 1799-1806, as living on Fox Run a tributary of Bullskin Creek, in Shelby Co. In 1806 he moved into Indiana Territory, settling four miles from the Ohio River. Samuel Smock and his brother-in-law Peter Van Cleave brought the first fruit trees to Jefferson Co., Indiana, c. 1811. At this time he joined the Madison Presbyterian Church. In 1811 he, along with two other men, was appointed the first Indiana Territorial Associate Judge of Jefferson County. This amounted to being a Circuit Court Magistrate, and Justice-of-the-Peace. He was appointed a Major of Militia for Jefferson County on March 7, 1811. By the end of the War of 1812 he had rose to the rank of Colonel of Jefferson County Militia. In July 1813 Sam became the first Jefferson County Postmaster and his settlement called Smocksville became the first Post Office. Smocksville was located in section #16, which was designated as the area set aside for the Public Schools. Since the village of Smocksville had been established prior to the establishment of the sections a lengthy court and civic battle took place. Samuel eventually abandoned his settlement and left the area to prove he was not trying to profit from or defraud anyone from his establishing a settlement in the section. The property was later sold in 1825. Samuel was elected a delegate to the Constitutional Convention meeting at Corydon June 10, 1816. He represented Jefferson County. As a member he assisted in the drafting of the first Constitution for the newly designated state. Indiana became a state December 11, 1816. He ran for a seat in the first Indiana State Legislature in 1817 but lost. On June 24, 1823 Samuel joined the Hanover Presbyterian Church. He was the 69th member but was assigned church pew # 2. Pews were assigned by seniority, and seniority was attained by the size of a person's donation to the church. On February 5, 1824 he was elected and ordained an Elder of the Hanover Presbyterian Church. In 1826 he was a delegate to the Synod at Vincennes. Samuel was instrumental in organizing Hanover Academy, which a few years later became a college. He was a member of the first board of trustees; being the Chairman of the Board in 1831, and the Treasurer for 1832-1833. There wasn't a grain mill located very close to the area where Samuel lived, causing everyone to carry their grain many miles to have it ground. He built a hand powered grain mill and allowed his neighbors to use it free. He owned lot #19, located in Madison City.
